

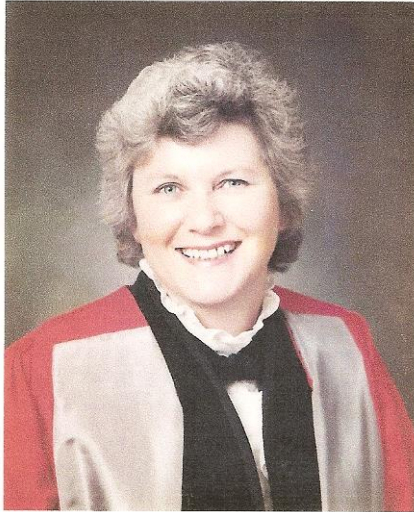

The BSHI Julia Bodmer Travel Award



To commemorate the life and work of Julia Bodmer and to recognise the seminal contributions she made to the field of human histocompatibility and immunogenetics, each year BSHI makes available an award of up to £2000. This is given with the aim of promoting the interaction and exchange of ideas between laboratories, either in the UK or overseas.

If you are a scientist at an early stage of your career working in H&I and have been a member of BSHI for at least one year this is an amazing opportunity to receive a bursary of up to £2000 to help fund a visit of any duration to another laboratory to carry out a specific piece of research or to transfer new technologies.

Applications for the Julia Bodmer Travel Award must include a short (max 2 pages) description of the proposed scientific project along with estimated costs and supporting letters from the directors of your own and the host laboratory. The budget outline must include laboratory costs, travel and subsistence.

The successful applicant is expected to write a report of the exchange visit to be published in the BSHI Newsletter and to give a short presentation at the BSHI annual conference.

Applications for travel in 2018 should be sent to the BSHI secretary (Deborah.Pritchard3@wales.nhs.uk) no later than 30th April 2018. Applications will be reviewed by the Research Executive and the successful candidate ratified by the Education Board. Notification of the outcome will be given by the end of May 2018.
